Dear Ladies,



ACTIVITIES UPDATE

FR. VIRGIL CORDANO CENTER (FVCC) was closed at the beginning of the pandemic due to public health restrictions. To continue contact with FVCC companions, a community outreach program was established. A new van has been purchased. It has signage identifying it on the outside with the Fr. Virgil Cordano Outreach Center logo. Cynthia Estrada, Program Director, and Sister Maria Hoa, Director of Vincent's Heart, Outreach, and Volunteers, go out during the week to visit



the various encampments to see how the members are doing and to deliver brown bag lunches, mail, sleeping bags, solar phone chargers, etc.

Arrangements have also been made with a local laundromat to provide specific days and times for the FVCC companions to come to do their laundry. The staff from the FVCC

meet them with coins and soap. The Franciscan Friars provide bag lunches which are distributed at this time.

The current FVCC is being used as a staging center where bag lunches are prepared. Volunteers are needed to make lunches at the Center and to accompany Cynthia and Sister Maria the deliveries. Karen in Harnetiaux, a Lady of Charity, is one of the volunteers who makes lunches at the Center and accompanies Cynthia to make deliveries. Fr. John and the Franciscan Friars have also been accompanying Cynthia and Sr. Maria in giving out lunches at the parks. If interested, contact Sister Maria at srhoa@sv-sb.org.




EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION CENTER

BROWN BAG LUNCHES AT SHOWERS OF BLESSING

In June, volunteers were requested to bring brown bag lunches to the Homeless who gather at the Showers of Blessing sites. It was made known by the manager that the people were hungry. Twelve Ladies of Charity volunteered to make the brown bag lunches and deliver to the four different sites. The teams of two, once a week, make the brown bag lunches and deliver them to one of the sites. The homeless brothers and sisters are very grateful for the gift of food.

There is a need for small tubes of sunscreen and new cotton underwear for men (shorts) and women (panties). These items can be dropped off at St. Vincent's office.

FAMILY STRENGTHENING PROGRAM

The Family Strengthening Program has been able to remain open during the COVID-19 pandemic. We currently have nine moms and ten children in the program. By mid-September there should be 13 moms and 16 children.

There is a need for diapers (sizes 4, 5, 6). These can be dropped off at St. Vincent's office.

NEW MODERATOR

We are pleased to announce that Sister Arthur Gordon, DC has been appointed as the new Moderator for the Ladies of Charity of Santa Barbara. The Moderator is appointed by the Provincial Superior of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. The Sister Moderator is an ex-officio member of the Executive Board and all committees. As Moderator, Sister Arthur's responsibility is to assist with the spiritual formation of the Ladies of Charity. She also serves as Vice President for Mission Integration & Archives at St. Vincent's.
